

How to request TNR services

The FBI assist caregivers of free-roaming cats regardless of location. To receive TNR assistance, we ask the following of you:

- You must be providing regular food and water for the cats, and be willing to continue doing so
- You must ensure the cats have adequate shelter that does not cause problems for neighbors

- You must return the cats to the area from which they were trapped
- You must agree to and sign the surgical release form (including the mandatory ear cropping procedure)

- You must pay the service fee of \$25 for each cat

You will be expected to trap the cats and arrange transportation to the scheduled surgical appointment(s). If you have a disability that prevents you from being able to trap the cats, we can put you on a list of people who will need volunteer assistance. This assistance is very limited, and this will likely result in significant delays.

What we provide to you:

- Scheduling of spay/neuter surgery appointment(s)

- Access to humane traps (refundable deposit required)
- Comprehensive instructional materials
- Ongoing advice and assistance on managing your cat colony
- Access to medical assistance for ill or injured colony cats
- Information on registering your colony/cats with applicable local agency
